

Confederation of Registered Essence Practitioners (COREP) Health and Safety Policy 2013

The Confederation of Registered Essence Practitioners (COREP) recognises that healthy and safe conditions are vital to achieving practitioner, teaching and learning excellence. The Confederation, therefore, requires all practitioners to ensure they are up to date with current practice and that they have sufficient information, instruction and training to safely carry out their consultations and teaching activities. in ways that present no risk of injury or ill health to practitioners, clients, tutors or students and give rise to no damage to any equipment, materials or any other property as a result of accidents, fires or dangerous occurrences.

This is a process of continuous improvement and relies primarily on the systematic identification, assessment and control of hazards and risks, underpinned by awareness of the relevant legislative requirements.

The success of this policy requires the involvement and commitment of everybody involved. All COREP practitioners take a primary responsibility to ensure the implementation and maintenance of health and safety controls and procedures.

COREP requires everybody involved in consultations or courses to practise, teach or study in a way which presents no risk to themselves or others.

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Every COREP practitioner has an obligation to operate in the day-to-day implementation of this policy and to take reasonable care for their own health and safety and the safety of other people who may be affected by their acts or omissions.
